

Resident Bill of Rights - This Months Highlight!

Right to quality care and self-determination

- 20. Every resident has a right to ongoing and safe support from their caregivers to support their physical, mental, social and emotional wellbeing and their quality of life and to assistance in contacting a caregiver or other person to support their needs.
- 21. Every resident has the right to have any friend, family member, caregiver or other person of importance to the resident attend any meeting with the licensee or the staff of the home.
- 22. Every resident has the right to designate a person to receive information concerning any transfer or any hospitalization of the resident and to have that person receive that information immediately.

Director's Message

Dear Residents, Families and Friends,

It is crucial that we monitor and document all food related allergens accurately to keep our residents and team members safe. We at times have residents and team members with documented allergies that could result in health risks if exposure to the allergen occurs.

Health Canada requires all 'priority allergens' to be clearly labeled on food products. This includes peanuts, tree nuts, soy, wheat/gluten, egg, milk, seafood, sesame, sulfites and mustard. These will be often listed on the label as 'Contains' or 'May Contain' statements. 'May Contain' statements are required to identify that although the product does not necessarily contain a named allergen, it is manufactured in a factory were there is a risk of cross contamination in its products.

We do our best in each of our long-term care homes to prevent cross contamination, however we cannot guarantee an allergen free environment, including a 'nut free', 'gluten free' or other allergens. This is secondary to the following:

- We do use most priority allergens as ingredients.
- We have only one main kitchen.
- We cannot guarantee that ingredients do not come in contact with each other at some point during production.

Jarlette Health Services has a process in place to ensure allergens are managed within the food service process.

Identification of Risk:

• Dietitians and Culinary Managers complete nutrition assessment for all residents, including review of allergens, and interventions may be put in place as required to avoid these allergens.





Director's Message

Communication of Risk:

- Documentation of all allergens in Point Click Care (allergen section on main dashboard) and the Master Diet List (MDL) for Point of Service reference by nursing and dietary team members.
- Provide allergen risk information to all new residents for full transparency prior to admission.

Education:

- For all team members on allergens and where to locate required information (eMAR dashboard, Master Diet List on snack/beverage carts, serveries) completed during onboarding and as required.
- For Culinary Managers on food ordering (how to find ingredients and potential allergens and potential 'nut free' products).

Purchasing and menu modifications:

- With the exception of the use of peanut butter in our homes, we do not purchase products with nuts or peanuts added as an ingredient.
- Depending on the allergen and its severity, there may be an individualized menu.

Please ensure that you bring any known food related allergies to the attention of our nursing team members, culinary manager or registered dietitian.
